

Jacob Wrestles an Angel



"Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with men and have overcome."

Gen 32:28

"He struggled with the angel and overcame him; he wept and begged for his favor." Hos 12:4

What does *Gen 32:25* suggest?
We need to back up and approach the event in context

The Character of Jacob

"Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the open country, while Jacob was a quiet man, staying among the tents." Gen 25:27

Heb "tam"; elsewhere: perfect (9), undefiled (2), upright (1)



Jacob is a man who is godly at his core – but has a significant character flaw

Jacob's Wrestling: Grabbing the Heel



After this, his brother came out, with his hand grasping Esau's heel; so he was named Jacob.

Gen 25:26

"Jacob" = grasps the heel Hebrew Idiom: 'to deceive or take advantage of'

God declared that Jacob, the younger, would rule over the elder

"Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you will be separated; one people will be stronger than the other, and the older will serve the younger." Gen 25:23

To what extent is Jacob allowed to 'facilitate' this end?

Jacob's Wrestling: Birthright & Blessing



Esau came in from the open country, famished. He said to Jacob, "Quick, let me have some of that red stew! I'm famished!"... Jacob replied, "First sell me your birthright." Gen 25:29-31

"May God give you heaven's dew and earth's richness— an abundance of grain and new wine. May nations serve you and peoples bow down to you. Be lord over your brothers, and may the sons of your mother bow down to you." Gen 27:28-29

What were the Birthright & the Blessing?



What were the consequences of Jacob's wrestling?


- He made his brother homicidally angry Gen 27:34,41
- He (probably) never saw his mother again

To Take or Not to Take?

It was God's will for David to be king in place of Saul



"Today God has delivered your enemy into your hands." ... But David said to Abishai, "Don't destroy him! Who can lay a hand on the LORD's anointed and be guiltless? As surely as the LORD lives," he said, "the LORD himself will strike him" 1 Sam 26:8-10



Jacob's Wrestling: "Best" Wife; "Best" Flocks





How many years did Jacob work for Leah?

Jacob works 7 years for Rachel – gets Leah Is given Rachel for another 7 years' work How must Leah feel?

14 yrs for Rachel; 6 yrs for cattle

"Do not take your wife's sister as a rival wife" Lev 18:18

Jacob, however, took fresh-cut branches from poplar, almond and plane trees... So the weak animals went to Laban and the strong ones to Jacob. Gen 30:37-42



What were the consequences of Jacob's wrestling?

- Leah is unloved Gen 29:30
- Wives/Sisters now competing
- Uncle & cousins angry, cut him off Gen 31:1-2,52

Jacob Wrestles an Angel (Revisited)



"Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with men and have overcome." Gen 32:28

What does the wrestling reveal about Jacob's opinion of God?

God isn't kind enough to bless; the blessing must be wrestled from Him

Consequence? He wasn't able to walk properly again Gen 32:31

"He will punish Jacob according to his ways and repay him according to his deeds. But doesn't Hosea praise In the womb he grasped his brother's heel; Jacob's wrestling? as a man he struggled with God.

He struggled with the angel and overcame him; he wept and begged for his favor...

But you must return to your God." Hos 12:2-6

Angel's Blessing

"...you have struggled with God and with men and have overcome."

So what is God <u>really</u> saying to Jacob?

Recall Gen 32:25

I suspect God has given "the deceiver" a deceptive (ironic) name: "ISRAEL"

What was the Angel unable to overcome?



"When the [angel] saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man." Gen 32:25

So what is it the angel cannot overcome?

- Jacob's stubbornness was unbreakable
- The angel crippled Jacob physically to help Jacob begin to realize this




Did Israel learn his lesson?



Not that day, his wrestling continued:

- Self-protection of Joseph Gen 37:12-13
- Self-protection of Benjamin Gen 42:2-4





God Takes Everything Away



Finally, Israel stands before Pharaoh: old, homeless, lame, bereaved & hungry. He has nothing left to wrestle with, or for

"Few and evil have the days of the years of my life been..." Gen 47:9

Finally, "Israel" is weak



God Gives Everything Back

"...settle your father and your brothers in the best part of the land. Let them live in Goshen." Gen 47:5

Joseph also provided his father and his brothers and all his father's household with food. Gen 47:12

So [the Egyptians] brought their livestock to Joseph, and he gave them food in exchange for their horses, their sheep and goats, their cattle and donkeys. Gen 47:17



So Joseph bought all the land in Egypt for Pharaoh. Gen 47:20

Israel said to Joseph, "Now I am ready to die, since I have seen for myself that you are still alive."

Gen 46:30



How Can I Learn from Israel's Experience?

I shouldn't wrestle with my brothers - what am I trying to win?



"People are often unreasonable and self-centered. Forgive them anyway. If you are kind, people may accuse you of ulterior motives. Be kind anyway. If you are honest, people may cheat you. Be honest anyway. The good you do today may be forgotten tomorrow. Do well anyway. Give the world the best you have and it may never be enough. Give your best anyway."

"For you see, in the end, it is between you and God. It was never between you and them anyway."
